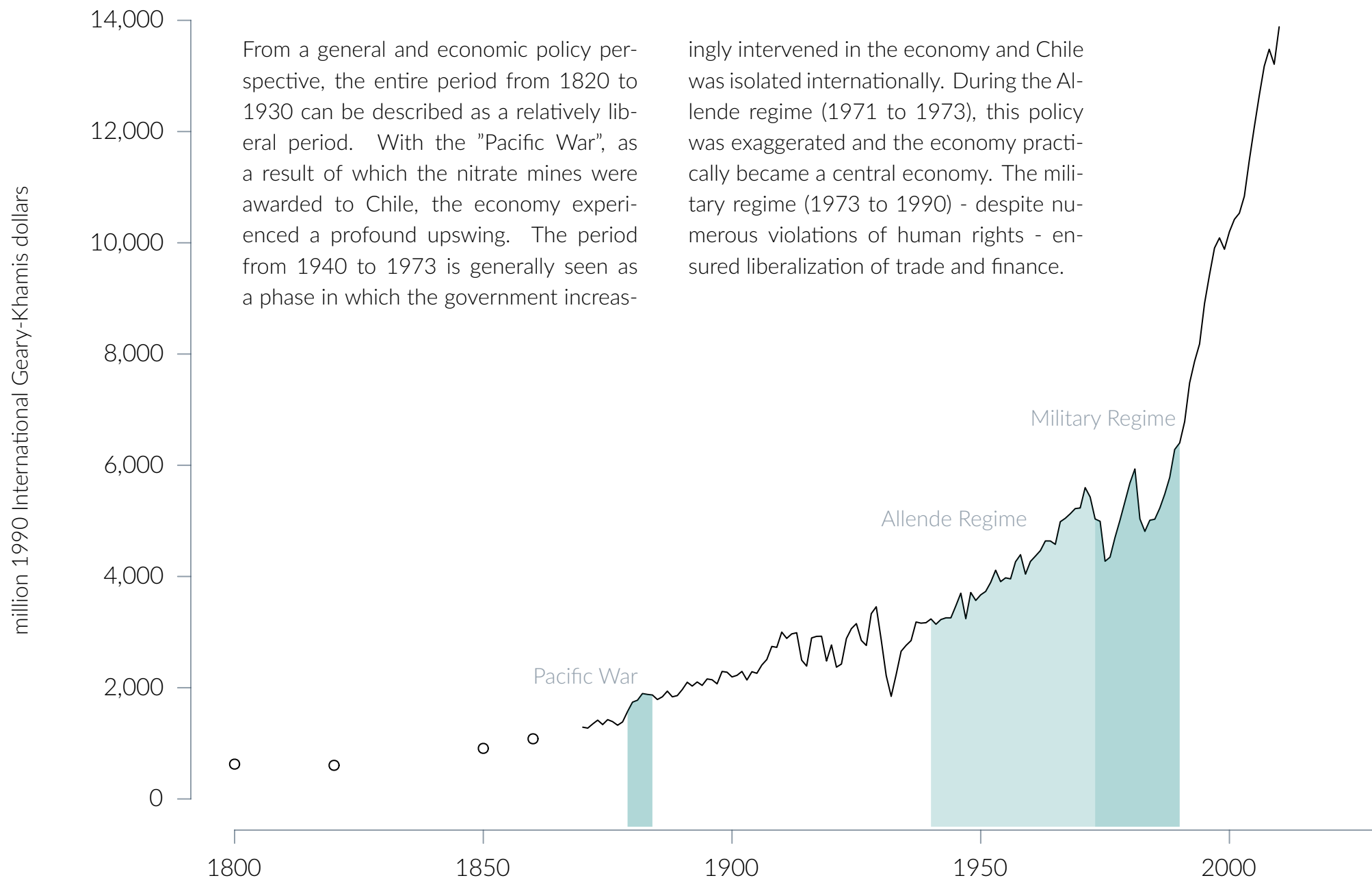


# Gross national product of Chile

Annual figures



From a general and economic policy perspective, the entire period from 1820 to 1930 can be described as a relatively liberal period. With the "Pacific War", as a result of which the nitrate mines were awarded to Chile, the economy experienced a profound upswing. The period from 1940 to 1973 is generally seen as a phase in which the government increas-

ingly intervened in the economy and Chile was isolated internationally. During the Allende regime (1971 to 1973), this policy was exaggerated and the economy practically became a central economy. The military regime (1973 to 1990) - despite numerous violations of human rights - ensured liberalization of trade and finance.
